To mark the beginning of Advent, the music in today's service is from the **Gloria** by Antonio Vivaldi (1678-1741). This setting of the ancient Christian hymn probably dates from around 1715 and was most likely composed for the choir of the Venetian orphanage at which Vivaldi held a position as master of music. The text, the same *Gloria* which is sung or said as part of the mass, opens with the words the angels sang as they announced the birth of Christ to the shepherds. You can find a translation of this Latin text at 647 in the hymnal.
